Move Against Hungarians. Copenhagen, Mar. 25.—The Czechoslovaks are mobilizing an army at Ostrava (150 miles north of BudaPest) to march against the Hungarians, a Vienna dispatch reported today.

Superintendent Todd called attention to the recent communication from the government authorities regarding the maintenance of military drill and equipment in the high schools of the state, and he was authorized to make application to the proper sources for the equipment, providing it entailed no additional expense to the school.
