To be called late this afternoon or tomorrow morning in the circuit court is a case entitled C. M. LaFollette vs. S. W. Jones. Mr. Jones sues for possession of 25 head of ewes, 5 lambs and one Shropshire ram, or for the payment of \$887.50, and \$300 additional damages.

Mary E. Hawks has brought suit for a divorce from Andrew Hawkes. She alleges desertion about 16 years ago.

A petition has been filed before the county court asking the appointment of Jennette Lockhart as executrix of the last will and testament of Pauline Adams, who died Feb. 9, 1919. The estate is valued at \$5000 in real estate besides \$2200 in personal property. Pauline Adams was never married and her next of kin are Mary Adams, a sister living in Salem; Irene Adams, a half sister of Portland; Mrs. W. Hinkle, a step sister of Portland; and Mrs. D. M. French, a step sister of The Dalles. Frank Meredith, a nephew, named in the will as executor, has declined to serve. As Jennette Lockhart is an aunt of the decedent, the petition requests her appointment as executrix of the estate.

Benjamin Bowden has filed suit for divorce from Sarah E. Bowden. They were married Dec. 19, 1896, and he alleges that she deserted him after about ten years of married life. There are no children nor property rights involved. For being bitten by a spider, the California industrial accident commission has granted Benn Gresswell \$303.91.

Artesia, Cal., March 25.—Fifty to one hundred thousand dollars is the range of estimates of the loot secured by a daring pair of bankrobbers who robbed the First National bank of Artesia here early today.

Washington, Mar. 26.—Sailings of transports were announced today by the war department as follows:

Transport Ulan from Brest, due New York April 4, with the 323rd field artillery, field and staff, headquarters and supply companies, ordnance and medical detachment; batteries A, B, C and F, for Camp Custer; base hospital 112; casual company 755.

Transport La Lorraine, Havre, due New York March 31 with casual companies 2476, 2477, 2478, 2480, 2481, scattered; special casual company 2474
Transport Aquitania, from Brest, due New York March 29, with 85th division headquarters for Camp Custer; 85th division headquarters troop for Camp Kearney; 162nd infantry brigade headquarters for Camp Custer; 347th field artillery for Camps Kearny, Funston, Lewis and Dodge; 348th field artillery for Camps Dix and Upton; detachment 112th ammunition train for Camp Dix; detachment 135th field artillery for Camp Upton; 145th infantry companies P, G, H, K, I, L and M for Camps Sherman, Upton, Funston, Dodge and Devens; medical camp detachment 146th infantry for Camps Upton, Devens, Taylor, Funston, Sherman; 337th infantry, field and staff, headquarters supply companies for Camps Custer and Kearny; base hospital 92, base hospital unit 40, casual companies 1017, 749, scattered; 69 soldiers' wives and six wives of naval officers are also aboard.

Market Rather Quiet For Securities Today

New York, Mar. 26.—The New York Evening Sun financial review today said:

Today's rather quiet and heavy market for securities seemed to be an expression of Wall Street's desire to know just what proportion of fact and of chicane there may be in the political and social fermentation taking place in Europe and which has burdened the cables in the past few days.

The steel, oil and motor shares were subjected perhaps to the greatest pressure. The rails were lightly dealt in and not slightly changed. The formal announcement that the war finance corporation would advance money to the individual carriers on the collateral of the railroad administration certificates had little effect.

Stocks were in supply through the afternoon, though selling pressure was far from urgent. Prices continued to ease off gradually. Steel dropped below 97. Others in that group yielded about a point. Royal Dutch shares suffered heavily.
