The government really intends to nesist soldiers who have been wounded or injuled in any way during their serv-ices in the late war and to look into such matters and to confer with men who might be given some assistance, Edward G. Cox has been in the city the past week. Mr. Cox is head of the redsral board for vocational education, de partment of rehabilitation and he cam to Salem on this trip as vocational ad-

The work of the vocational advisor is o confer with men who have been in jured or wounded and to talk over with them as to what the vocational board can do and what course of study or edaention can be undertaken to best pre pare men for their future work.

With some of the men who wished to follow special lines of furming such as poultry, the government will make ar-rangements for their assenting the Oregon Agricultural college. Others who have mechanical ability will be assisted securing the training that will make them expert workmen.





Girls' Glee Club Rehearsing on Exceptional Program




