He reiterated that the league of nations covenant is not delaying the peace settlement but indicating that the reparations question has badly hampered deliberations during the past week. The congressmen gathered that Wilson would not stand for much more dellying. One declared his belief the president is prepared to return to the United States when the conference's work is completed, tell the people the results were the best that could be obtained under the circumstances and then leave it up to the senate to accept or reject the treaty. Monroe Doctrine May Go. In this connection, it was said the president evidently reached the conclusion that he could not obtain a clause definitely protecting the Monroe doctrine and was nearly ready to accept the covenant without a specific Monroe doctrine section. The congressman said the

consensus of the delegations' opinion was that there ought to be some provision in the league constitution whereby zones of primary responsibility would be established, thereby relieving America of the necessity for participating in minor, European squabbles.

Burgess Ford Home; Tells Of Experiences Under Fire Burgess Ford, who has seen some exciting service with the Y. M. C. A. at St. Mihiel and the Argonne forest, is in the city for a day or so with his family, visiting at the home of his father Rev. T. B. Ford. He was with the 90th division consisting mostly of Texas and Oklahoma men and was in close touch with all this division's work along the fighting front. Although in the Y. M. C. A. service, during the big advance at St. Mihiel he was under fire for days at a time. His most narrow escape was when his trousers were pierced by a machine gun bullet and with the exception of himself and another man, every man in two squads of 12 each was either wounded or killed. As to the capturing of any of the American boys by the Germans, Mr. Ford said there was no such thing excepting when men who were out on patrol duty were taken at night or when a box barrage was thrown over some advanced position. The American artillery had its shooting down to such a fine point that as soon as a nest of German machine guns was located and the American boys given the location, the German guns were soon out of business. On returning Mr. Ford was stationed a short time at Marseilles and had the pleasure of stopping 24 hours at Gibraltar and of taking a day's trip to Tangiers in Africa, opposite Ft. Gibraltar.

## STATE LEGISLATOR HELD FOR MURDER OF YOUTH

Bandon, Or., March 31.—George Chenoweth is in jail today having been charged with the murder of G. W. Sydman. Chenoweth, who served in the last Oregon legislature as acting joint representative of Coos and Curry counties, walked into a dance hall at Langlos Saturday night and fired three shots into Sydman without any warning. The assailant immediately delivered himself up to an officer, saying he hoped he had killed Sydman. His wish came true, for the young man died a few hours later. Chenoweth was too old to join the American army when the United States declared war, so he enlisted in a Canadian regiment, serving in hot battles overseas. The war veteran claims his daughter was wronged by Sydman.
