The annual meeting of the First Presbyterian church brought out a good attendance, the supper tables being crowded with from 150 to 200 people. Following the plentiful repast, Rev. T. S. Anderson, presiding over the meeting, led in a word of prayer and a scripture passage. In the election of officers, the rules were suspended and short work was made of re-electing the former boards of elders, deacons and trustees. The only new officers being the election of Fred Cook to fill a vacancy on the board of elders, and Fred Smith to fill a vacancy on the board of deacons. As the work of the board of deacons was practically covered in the New Era program, it was decided to leave these positions vacant. W. H. Steinhoff, presiding over the business session, called for reports from all the departments, and while these went to

show that the church, along with others in the city, had suffered during the war period, and especially from the influenza epidemic, the finances of the church had been well maintained. More than \$700 have been devoted to benevolences and \$2000 paid on the new lots purchased for the church last year. The budget for the present year proposes an expenditure of \$4000, and in addition a payment of \$1000 more on the lots, on which there is still an indebtedness of \$4000. The membership, after deducting losses by death and removal, is considerably over 600. In the Sunday school, the primary department shows a membership of about 60, the Credit Roll 52, and the Home Department 35 members. Harold Cook, as head of the Boy Scout contingent, gave a spirited account of the work being done by the two troops in the church, which he dem-

onstrated to be one of the liveliest factors in it. Among other matters brought up in the meeting was that of the celebration of the fiftieth anniversary of the founding of the church, which occurs on the 15th of May. Supt. Geo. Albert, of the Sunday school, moved that they "have the biggest blow-out on record," and for this end a committee of half a dozen active workers were named to make arrangements.
