ANNIVERSARY PLANS TAKE SHAPE RAPIDLY

For Observance Of Champoug Meeting, May 2, Being Arranged.

The 76th anniversary of the celebrated meeting at Champoug will be held May 2 and already Judge P. H. D'Arcy, president of the Champoug Memorial association, is arranging a program.

The last legislature appropriated another \$5,000 for the building of a proper memorial site and this money will be expended in adding to and improving the building erected last summer.

Judge D'Arcy says that this improvement will not be made until late this summer or next fall and therefore the memorial building will appear this year just the same as at the 1918 meeting.

It may be recalled that 102 settlers in the valley responded to the call May 2, 1843, to form a provisional government for the northwest.

On that momentous day, a vote was taken and the French settlers and those interested in the Hudson Bay company voted the loudest.

A provisional government was at once formed, and it was in this government that the Methodist pioneers took such an active part.

Only two men are living in Salem whose fathers took part in the famous Champoug meeting. These are Oliver Beers and Almer Lewis.

By Lowell Mellett. (United Press Staff Correspondent.) Paris, April 2.—There is now before the peace conference a definite and concrete proposal from the Russian government for resumption of hostilities.

There is also authoritative confirmation that Karl Kautsky, German radical, is now in Moscow trying to arrange a formal alliance between Germany and Russia.

The reports made by William Bullitt, special agent of the American delegation and Lincoln Steffens, writer and private investigator, are undergoing the gravest consideration as they represent not only the latest but the most detailed and best information on actual conditions in Russia, as well as the attitude of Russian leaders.

The greatest secrecy surrounds the Lenin document, but it is known that it offers to end hostilities between the Russian and British governments.

The willingness of the delegates to give thoughtful consideration to the new proposition is believed to be the outgrowth of various considerations, the most important of which is that it presents an apparent opportunity to break at the outset the rapidly forming bolshevik front—Russia and Hungary and with Germany, Rumania and Serbia in the offing.

GERMAN STRIKE FAST SPREADING, IS REPORT

Indications Point To Spartacans As Instigators Of Disturbances.

By Frank J. Taylor. (United Press Staff Correspondent.) Berlin, April 1.—The general strike is spreading through Germany. Clashes have occurred between workers and troops in various cities, resulting in casualties.

The indications are growing that the Spartacans who are believed to be employing these disturbances to weaken the government, preparatory to declaring a third revolution.

Seize Is Proclaimed. The government has proclaimed a state of siege in the whole Rhineland, defying the 50,000 miners on strike there.

During riots in Frankfurt mobs stormed several food shops. Three persons were killed and many wounded by rifle and machine gun fire.

Reliance of Herr Dammig, radical leader, charged with inciting the Spartacans uprising in January, has temporarily allied the general strike in Berlin. The metal workers here, however, threaten to walk out of their own initiative.

Many persons were killed and wounded in fighting with soldiers at Castrop near Bochum (26 miles northeast of Dusseldorf).

Wurttemberg has joined the general strike. At Stuttgart the bourgeoisie have started a counter strike, completely paralyzing the city's industries.

Counter strike by more conservative elements has also been declared in the Ruhr district where troops are exercising strenuous measures to control the workers.
