period of two years been the declaration of intention to become an American citizen and the final examination before the circuit judge.  
Representative Hawley has received a letter from the assistant chief of staff, war department, stating that about 500 soldiers of the 63d Infantry, now stationed at East Potomac Park, near Washington, will soon be discharged. Also that about 100 men, selected according to the emergency of their reasons for discharge, will be released within a short time and that further reductions of the Oregon force will be made from time to time as the special duties of the men will permit. The regiment to which the Oregon soldiers are attached is being used to guard government property and in other duties and it is necessary to keep an adequate force at present. It is hoped that regular troops may displace the Oregon men at an early date, permitting them to receive their discharges and return to civil life.  
The Salem Abstract company have been so over run with business during the past few weeks that they have been obliged to employ extra help. A question as to comparative records sought the information that the transactions in real estate as taken from court records are approximately one third greater than at this time last year. Mr. Hanson furnishes the following figures for the three months of January, February and March. This year the transfers ran 450, 533 and 703 respectively. For the same period last year they were 369, 445 and 543 respectively. While these figures do not all represent transfers of property, they do show that there is a good deal of activity. It was noted that a large proportion of the property exchanges were farms and fruit tracts.  
The Knights of Pythias will hold a special meeting Tuesday evening for the initiation of a special rank team. Delegates will be present from the Independence, Dallas and Silverton lodges.  
The United States employment bureau continues to have calls for workers for the hop yards at \$3 a day. Those willing to work in setting out strawberries are offered \$4 a day while \$2.50 a cord seems to be the prevailing figure for wood cutters. There is also a call for women as housekeepers in the country. The figure for farm hands run from \$40 to \$50 a month with an occasional better offer.
