In response to an invitation from Charles S. Whitman of New York, chairman of the national committee for the Salvation Army drive, Governor Olcott has consented to represent the state of Oregon on that committee and lend his support to the movement to raise funds for the work of that organization. In replying he says:

"I take it as an honor to be called upon to serve as a member of the national campaign committee and represent Oregon in that capacity in the campaign you are conducting for funds with which to finance the various services of that organization to our people at home. The magnificent work which this organization did for our men overseas deserves nothing but the highest praise and the heartiest cooperation of all the people in advancing their work and welfare at home."

One of the cases coming before the supreme court today is the friendly suit in which Governor Olcott seeks by mandamus proceedings to compel State Treasurer Hoff to issue the warrant for the governor's salary for the month of March. It is expected that this action will decide the status of the governor in his relation to the office of secretary of state.

State House Notes
 The formal announcement of the candidacy of Christ Schabel for the unexpired term of the late Walter A. Dimick may be looked for at any time. Mr. Schabel was active in securing the passage of important legislation in the last assembly, notably the bill relating to inheritances and incomes which is expected to add more than \$300,000 to the state revenues. He bases his expectations upon his record as an advocate of constructive legislation.

A meeting has been called in the governor's office next Tuesday morning, at which the permanent organization of the Oregon Land Settlement commission will be effected by the selection of a chairman, secretary and manager. Governor Olcott has announced that all the members who have been requested to serve on the commission have accepted and will be present at the coming meeting. They are Henry Olmsted and Whitney L. Baine of Portland; R. N. Stanfield of Stanfield; G. H. Baker of Bend; Charles Hall of Marshfield. In this meeting they will formulate plans and make known policies with regard to the work of placing returned soldiers and sailors on the land. The commission will be regularly incorporated under the laws of Oregon, placing its capital stock at \$50,000 which is the amount appropriated for the work by the legislature.
