

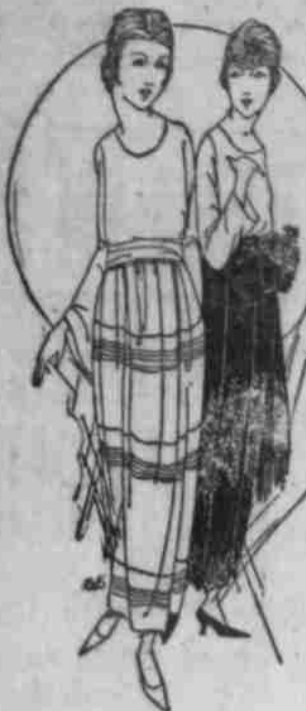

ENTIRE NEW ENGLAND

President Wilson charged that the postmaster general is wrecking the democratic party and demanded that he be removed and the strike settled. A general strike of all labor in New England is predicted if the strike is not settled in a very short time.

The possibilities of a nation-wide strike of telephone employes have advanced from the stage of being considered to the point where plans for such

a move are in the making. The strikers in New England are constantly being assured of the support of unions in every state.

Upon the results of this demonstration, perhaps in even a shorter time than the public believes it possible, the strike may spread to every city, town and hamlet in the country.

Situation Tense.

Boston, Mass., April 18.—(United Press.)—The situation in the telephone strike throughout New England was tense today, following a series of clashes

between crowds of strike sympathizers and strikebreakers in which several students of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology were beaten.

With the strike in its fourth day there were no indications of a break in the ranks of the strikers, who still maintain that they will not negotiate through the channels which Postmaster General Burleson declares they must use before the wage increase question will be considered.
