treats. He found the cider was not of the unobscure variety but was of the kind with raisins, producing thereby the desired kick. He also reported that one could buy a good drunk in Salem for from 50 cents to \$1. He blames Portland for the real booze found in the city. When that city got a good supply, some of it came to Salem.  
The ways and means committee of the council reported against allowing the bill of \$15,514.11 against the city, of the Clarke-Henry Co. This is the company that paved Twelfth street from Mission to the south city limits. Warrants for the work were not paid for lack of funds. The report states that the company knew at the time the paving was done that there would be litigation and there was no negligence on the part of the city because there was no money on hand to pay the warrants for this work.

### Taxpayers Ask Time

M. E. Pogue represented a number of tax payers, who petitioned the city not to foreclose improvement liens just as the property was becoming valuable and just when real estate was beginning to move in the north part of the city. He said it would discourage prospective purchasers if the city began foreclosure proceedings and that after so many property owners had held their property during slow times, it would not be fair for the city to take it away from them just as the real estate market was looking up. Mr. Pogue said the reason many had not paid was because they did not have the money. Referring to the Oaks addition, he said that many property owners would lose their property if suits were brought to foreclose improvement liens. The council took no definite action.

### May Sell Rollers

The city attorney and treasurer were instructed to issue certificates of delinquency to the city on all property in the Oaks addition improvement project which are four years or more delinquent and to also take all necessary and proper proceedings to get these delinquent liens in shape for foreclosure. This means that the city authorities have finally decided to begin at once foreclosure proceedings in the Oaks addition.

The city has two big rollers, part of its paving plant for sale and the proposition now before the council is whether to accept one bid of \$1500 to be paid in gravel and stone at the regular rate or take \$1000 cash. Both of the bidders were from the same sand and gravel company.
