omitted from this program may receive their improvement.

**Treat Districts Equally**  
"You have asked this court for suggestions in regard to a more equitable distribution of the benefits. Estimated on the basis that each market section is paying four per cent of its assessed valuation, it appears that as near as practical, each market section should have expended therein this amount, in addition to such a proportion of the amounts raised in Salem as

may be deemed equitable.  
"If your committee can assist this court in suggesting an appropriate expenditure of these amounts in each section, it will be greatly appreciated. It is suggested that recommendations be made only after consulting the wishes of the people in each market section in regard to the roads they wish improved. In several instances, amounts available for expenditure in market sections run from one hundred thousand to upwards of a quarter of a million dollars, which are paid for by the tax payers of that district, and it is due them that opportunity be given them to dictate the expenditure of the funds rather than to leave it to the judgment of a single representative

**BLACK ROCK POST OFFICE TO OPEN**

During his visit here this week, Postoffice Inspector E. C. Clement made arrangements for the re-opening of the Black Rock post office, with Mrs. Vivian King as postmistress. The office will be opened as soon as Mrs. King's appointment has been approved by the department.

Mr. Clement also announced that service would again be established at the postoffice of Parker, near Independence just as soon as some one can be secured to qualify as postmaster. Both the Black Rock and Parker offices were discontinued some time ago because of the resignation of the postmasters.—Dallas Itemizer.

from their district, who might not be conversant with the wishes of all the tax payers of the section generally.

**Equitable Budget Needed**  
The county court also states in the letter its position on a fair distribution of the funds as follows:

"By apportioning to each road its fair proportion of the moneys to be derived by the proposed bond issue and duplicating this amount by direct taxation, we believe would divide the burdens and benefits of the program more equitably, will shorten the time it will take for completion and thus permit other sections to expect some assistance for their roads, and will materially reduce the total cost."

In conclusion, Judge Bushey and the commissioners say: "This court and your committee must bear in mind that the only way to get funds to give any section more than it is entitled to is to take away what rightfully belongs to another section. Consequently it is appropriate to first prepare an equitable budget, and then to remain in this budget."
