BUSINESS TELEPHONE

business service, as a ten party line is placed at a rent of \$3.25 a month, with the 25 cents extra for a desk set. No change has as yet been made in residence telephones and now will be made at least for one year. In adding \$1 a month to the rent for the business telephones, the public service commission established the present rentlessness (rate, which means they cannot be lowered or raised for one year. Ways Considered) In granting the application of the telephone company for an advance in rate, the public service commission took into the wage advances of the past year. It was estimated that the cost of telephone service constitutes from 55 to 60 per cent of all expenses. It was also estimated that wages at the present time are 33 per cent higher than two years ago and there is now pending a request on the part of electrical workers for an increase of from 50 cents to \$1 a day. In rendering its final order on the application for an advance in the rates the order permitting the advance is signed by Commissioners Fred G. Buel and H. H. Corey. Fred A. Williams, commissioner, rendered a separate opinion. However, he concurs in the order issued by the commission, advancing the rates of business telephones \$1 a month and establishing for year the present rate for residences.
