Governor Olcott has recently received from the governor of Illinois an application for extradition papers for one John Phelan, who is charged with the murder of his uncle, Lee Phelan, of Chicago. A GREAT deal of interest is being taken throughout the state in securing funds for the erection of the woman's building at Eugene. Eugene people will be given a chance to vote on a proposal to appropriate from the funds of the city the sum of \$5000 to go toward the fund. The city council at a recent meeting passed an ordinance calling a special election on June 3, the same date of the state election, to vote upon a charter amendment authorizing payment of that sum in 1920 to the board of regents.

The alumni of the university will launch a "flying squadron" this week to the work of completing the fund necessary for the erection of the women's building. The decision to speed up the campaign was made at the meeting of the team captains and the chairman of the committee at the Oregon building last night.

The state of Oregon, it was pointed out by K. K. Kuhl, of the Oregon Alumni association, apportioned to this building all it was able to appropriate and turn to this purpose under the six per cent limitation. "The rest," he said, "must be made up by contributions from friends of higher education and of the state university."
