CITY NEWS.

The Rt. Rev. Robert L. Paddock, D. D. bishop of eastern Oregon, will be in the city and speak in St. Paul's church Sunday evening. The bishop has just returned from France where he has been serving as chaplain for more than a year. He had some thrilling experiences participating in rescue work at the front and received distinguished service citations therefor. His lecture Sunday evening will describe the conditions over seas and his experiences in the great war. The rector of St. Paul's was formerly in Bishop Paddock's diocese for eight years and was therefore able to secure the bishop's coming to Salem for Sunday evening after an address in Trinity church, Portland, in the morning. The general public will be welcome.
