The chances are that the public service commission will not grant the petition compelling the Southern Pacific to place signalling devices at the corner of Capital and Union streets, according to City Attorney Macy. At the city council session last evening Mr. Macy said that no one volunteered to offer any evidence that the crossing was dangerous, but that the Southern Pacific had several of its big guns on hand to prove that a signalling device at the corner was not necessary. In presenting of the case, it was stated that the crossing at Union and Capital street in Salem was the most dangerous one on the S. P. between Ashland and Portland. Mr. Macy said that the Southern Pacific had such prestige at the state house that the petition of the city for safety devices at the corner would probably not be granted by the public service commission.

Chief of Police Varney is in receipt of a letter from Paul Cronenberg asking for help in locating his father who is supposed to have been drowned in the Willamette May 20. The father, the Rev. J. Cronenberg, mysteriously disappeared at Corvallis May 29 and has not been heard of since. His clothing were found on the banks of the river, leading his friends to believe that he had been drowned while in swimming. Under ordinary circumstances the body should come to the surface about the middle of the week, and son asks the police and those living along the river to keep a lookout. Should anyone find a body news should be telephoned to the Salem police headquarters.

Trees and overhanging branches over the sidewalks obstructing the way are regarded as an annoyance and the city park board has issued an order requiring such obstructions to be removed. According to the city ordinance, the park board has authority to compel property owners to keep their shade trees and parkings in condition and also the authority to enforce the ordinance. In case property owners do not properly trim the trees to prevent them from coming under the head of a nuisance, it is probable that the board will enforce the ordinance.
