Conservative estimates for the prune crop in the northwest place it at about 50 per cent of the crop of one year ago. Some estimate the Marion county crop at about half of the 1918 crop while others are of the opinion that the crop will not quite reach 30 per cent of one year ago. Due to the rains and favorable conditions so far this season, it is thought that the sizes will average large. The price this year is about three cents a pound higher than one year ago. The selling by the government of 65,000 cases of last year's crop will have no effect on the market, packers say, as the old crop does not directly come in competition with the 1919 crop.
