School districts throughout the county will soon receive statements from Ben F. West, county assessor, showing the total assessments of last year. This is done in order that district directors will know the amount of property assessed in each district and at the June meeting make a proper levy for school purposes. This is done in the smaller districts where it is possible to estimate exactly the expenses of the school for the coming school year. In large school districts, the budget is not made out until late in the fall.
Representative James S. Stewart reports that the meeting for good roads last night at Jefferson went over big. Which means that the people in that part of the county are lining up to vote for the bonds of Marion county necessary for the construction of 100 miles of hard surfaced roads, and 50 miles of gravelled roads, so constructed that these gravelled roads may be hardurfaced any time funds are available. Ed D. Smith, cashier of the Oregon State bank at Jefferson presided and David H. Looney, who voted for good roads during his last term of the legislature whenever he had a chance, was also on hand to greet his friend "Jim" Stewart. The campaign in the county will close with a rally at Liberty Saturday evening and big doings in Salem at the grandy next Monday night. Simon Benson of Portland, chairman of the state highway commission, and T. B. Kay are on the program for the Monday evening rally.
