A contract for delivering loganberries at a certain price may be enforced, according to the decision given yesterday in the circuit court in the case of the Phox company against E. Gansley. The company claimed that the number of pounds specified in the contract had not been delivered. Although the defendant made reply to the complaint, when the case was called yesterday, judgment was given by default for \$90 damages and \$50 attorney's fees. This is but one of the several cases to be brought by the company for violation of contract. Since the original loganberry contracts were made, the price has about doubled.

While the law permits a common carrier to transport liquors from one point in wet territory across dry territory to another point in wet territory, it does not permit an automobile to do this; for according to a recent opinion from Attorney General Brown an automobile is not a common carrier and persons traveling in such vehicles are of passengers in the common acceptance of the term. This decision was called out by the case of a man arrested in Southern Oregon in the act of driving a consignment of liquor from one point in California through a section of Oregon territory to another point in California.

Willamette university has just received from the press the annual catalogue for the year 1919-20, which provides for a continuation of the two semester plan of dividing the courses in all the departments with the exception of the law school, which will have the established four term plan, the first term opening the fore part of October.
