FRIENDS CHURCH IN SESSION AT NEWBERG

Twenty-Seventh Annual Meeting Opened With Large Attendance.

Newberg, June 12.—With the largest attendance at least for a good many years, Oregon yearly meeting of the Friends church opened Thursday its twenty seventh annual session, with over fifty members present who were present when the yearly meeting was organized in 1893, and a score who had attended every meeting since the original organization.

Among the leading visitors from other parts of Quakerdom were the following: Dr. Walter C. Woodward, general secretary of the Five Years meeting of Friends in America; George H. Moore, president of the American Friends board of Foreign missions; Daniel Lawrence and wife of League City, Texas, and a Mr. Osborne of Estlin, Va.

The departments of good literature and systematic and proportionate giving were the principal ones to report at the afternoon session, and the report of the latter was followed by a stirring and helpful address on the subject of Christian Stewardship by Fred K. Carter, pastor of the Newberg church.

After the report of the association executive committee on Indian affairs was read, a very interesting pageant was given showing the nature and importance of Friends work among the Indians. This work was in the hands of Mrs. Joseph Holligworth.

The opening meeting of the meeting on ministry and oversight occurred yesterday afternoon, and was also marked by an attendance far in excess of that of ordinary years. Reports on the spiritual conditions of the membership presented to this meeting were very gratifying.

Meetings at 8 a. m. and 8 p. m. under the leadership of Joseph H. Smith will be features of the annual gathering from now on. The morning meetings will be in the nature of studies in prophecy, the evening meetings being evangelistic.
