Monmouth, Or., June 13.—Miss Emma Parker, who died here last week of tuberculosis, was laid to rest in the K. P. cemetery south of town. The funeral services were held in the Christian church Wednesday afternoon with a large concourse of friends in attendance. Rev. Victor Morris conducted the services. A long train of automobiles loaded with sympathetic friends accompanied the remains to the cemetery and covered the grave with a mound of beautiful floral tributes.

Miss Park was twenty-four years of age and has lived most of her life in Monmouth. She was a very capable and ambitious young lady and a leader in the church. For over six years she has been in the service of the First National bank and at the time of her death occupied the position of assistant cashier. ### SILVERTON MAN WILLS \$10,000 TO RED CROSS

#### N. C. Liston Leaves Bulk Of Estate to Humanitarian Organization.

By the will of N. C. Liston of Silverton who died six months ago, the American Red Cross will profit \$10,000, according to the final account filed with the county court today by the executor F. E. Callister.

Mr. Liston left an estate valued at \$17,888.71. As he had never been married and had practically severed all connections with his relatives in the east, he left a will disposing of his estate.

In this will it was provided that the executor, F. E. Callister, should be empowered to spend \$5,000 for funeral expenses, suitable burial plot and such. But in the report of the executor, the statement is made that it was found necessary to expend only \$2,884.57 of the \$5,000, leaving \$2,115.43 to be placed as part of the estate.

Other items charged up against the estate include a bequest of \$1,000 to C. E. McIlwain and \$1,000 to F. E. Callister. Also \$2,500 for the Portland Crematorium Association for a memorial window, niche and urn.

After all claims against the estate had been paid and all bequests fulfilled, the executor reported to the court that he now has on hand \$10,525.01. According to the will, whatever part of the estate remained after all claims had been paid and bequests settled, should be given to the American Red Cross. Hence the American Red Cross will receive this amount.

### State House Notes

The State Highway Commission started today one of its most extended tours of investigation, going from Portland to Astoria and thence south through the state to the California line by a route not definitely stated. Among other important points of road to be visited are those in the vicinity of Newport. Lincoln, which voted bonds to the extent of \$180,000 wants a road to lead out from Newport to the Benton county line. The commission has agreed that if the county will pay for the grading of the seven-mile stretch from Newport to Toledo the surface work will be done before winter. Benton county is also eager to connect with the road to Newport and has voted \$200,000 for this purpose. The commission will advertise this project as soon as data can be gathered.

The State Fish and Game Commission has appointed Gene Simpson to the position as superintendent of pheasant production. Simpson was the man in charge of a pheasant farm which was acquired by the state. The Multnomah Anglers' Club made an unsuccessful attempt to have William Finley appointed to the position, with Simpson working under his supervision. It is expected that the commission will have more than 5,000 birds to release this fall. In order to give them further protection they have decided to close the pheasant season October 15.
