By the will of N. C. Liston of Silverton who died ax months ago, the American Red Cross will profit \$10, \$25.01, according to the final account filed with the amount court today.

Mr. Liston left an estate valued at \$17,858 PL., As he had never been married and had practically severed all connections with his relatives in the east, he left a will disposing of

his estate.

In this will it was provided that the executor, F. E. Callister, should be

In this will it was provided that the executor, F. E. Callister, should be empowered to spend \$5,000 for funeral expenses suitable burial plot and such. But in the report of the executor, the statement is made that it was found necessary to expend only \$2,884.57 of the \$5,000, leaving \$2,115.43 to be placed as part of the estate.

Other items charged up against the estate include a bequest of \$1,000 to C. E. McIlwain and \$1,000 to F. E. Callister. Also \$2,500 for the Portland Grematorium Association for a memorial windaw, niche and urn.

After all claims against the estate had been paid and all bequests fulfilled, the executor reported to the sourt that he now has on hand \$10,525.01. According to the will, whatever part of the estate remained after all claims had been paid and bequests settled, should be given to the American Red Cross. Hence the American Red Cross will receive this amount.
