SPREAD OF CANADIAN THISTLE IS FEARED

County Court Considers Enforcement Of Measures Against Pest.

The Canadian thistle is about to get the better of Marion county and unless something is done at once, the question of eradicating the weed will soon become a most serious one.

This is the stand taken by the Marion county court and it is probable that within a few days Judge Busbey will take action as provided by a special law passed during the sessions of the last legislature.

According to those who have been noting conditions, almost every farm in this part of the valley is threatened by the Canadian thistle. That it is spreading fast, is the opinion of those who have become interested in what may happen should nothing be done.

As to how the thistle manages to distribute itself is a debated question. The argument runs all the way from seed, gophers carrying the roots from place to place during the winter and the spreading of the roots by plowing.

It has been noted that along the Pudding river and in Howell prairie the Canadian thistle is spreading fast until it has already become a menace to landowners. No special efforts were made by the county court last year to kill thistles, excepting that Roadmaster Culver notified all road supervisors to mow along the road sides about this time of year.

It is conceded that many farmers have been active in killing the thistle but with others not caring for their lands, there has been the rapid growth until the county court now feels called upon to invoke the law recently passed.

The county court also notes the fact that right now thistles are getting ready to blossom and that now is the time to cut and prevent the bloom from spreading.

Chapter 287 of the general laws of the state of Oregon is as follows: "The county court of each county may appoint some suitable person whose duty it shall be to ascertain from time to time whether there is any weed known as the Canadian thistle and quack grass, and such person shall as he ascertains such weed, and before any has shed its bloom or commenced to form to shed seed, serve or cause to serve upon the owner of land or the occupants of the premises, notice that said noxious weeds are found to be growing."

There is a further provision of the same law that if the owner cannot be found and no one is living on the farm where the thistles are growing, that no-

ties to cut the thistles must be posted on three prominent places of the farm.

Then upon petition of owners of a majority of the land in the district, the county court shall enforce the provisions of a former law requiring the occupants or owners do not remove the weeds within 10 days of serving or posting the notice, then the county court may cause the same to be removed.

The expense of cutting the thistles are to be certified to the county court, and if not paid within 90 days, becomes a lien upon the land. The district attorney is then empowered to bring suit for the amount expended in cutting the thistles and to bring foreclosure proceedings.

The land is sold as inforeclosing any lien against land. The county court will make the appointment within a few days, as provided for by law and an earnest attempt made to save the county from the dangers of the Canadian thistle.

Phone Strikers Reject Compromise Wage Scale

San Francisco, June 24.—Telephone operators are prepared to day to reject the offer of the telephone company to pay \$12 a week to beginners and a sliding scale ranging to \$19 a week to other operators.

This, the operators allege, is misleading. They declare the maximum cannot be reached in less than seven years' service and only a small percentage of the operators would be benefited. The electrical workers also declare the basic \$6 a day wage offered them is too technically arranged.

SEABECK CONFERENCE SUCCESS SAYS DONEY

Willamette University Head And Family Return To Salem Today.

Dr. Carl G. Doney and family, who have been in attendance upon the sessions of the Christian Workers' conference at Seabeck, Wash., returned to Salem at 1 o'clock this morning, driving through from the camp since 7 o'clock Monday morning, a distance of over 200 miles which was made with no more serious mishap than a punctured tire. With them at the summer camp were Prof. Ebsen and Prof. Darden, of the university and a group of twenty students, who made themselves particularly noticeable by their athletic prowess. In the track meet the Willamette boys carried off the honors with a score of 33 points, their nearest competitors showing only about half that number.

The Willamette glee club quartet also covered itself with glory by their contributions to the program, one of their concerts being given on the water.

Dr. Doney was called upon to deliver three addresses, and also conducted a daily class, so that his time was well filled. There were about 190 student

and teacher delegates present, taking up all phases of religious, missionary and sociological work. A number of them definitely avowed themselves for the latter work during the sessions. He states unqualifiedly that this conference call together the most potentially influential and dynamic group of leaders and students known to the northwest. On the program are some of the strongest speakers of the country, and

the general atmosphere of the place is inspiring in the highest degree.
