## Portland Built Steamer On Maiden Trip Hits Rock

Portland, Or., June 27.—Running off her course and hitting a rock, the steamer West Harlan was seriously damaged this morning and instead of starting her maiden sea voyage, must be brought back to Portland for repairs.

Leaving Portland last night with a cargo of wheat for the Atlantic seaboard, the ship had reached a point 18 miles from the mouth of the Columbia river today when the rock was struck. The fore-peak was badly punctured, allowing water to enter the vessel and the steering gear was put out of commission.

The West Harlan was launched in Portland, May 30, by the Columbia River Shipbuilding corporation.
