Major Nesmith Back From France After Hard Service

Major Linn W. Nesmith, who has seen 14 months of hard service in France with the 2nd engineers, arrived in the city this morning from Boston, where he arrived with the remainder of the corps on the 26th of June. His work on the construction of roads and bridges took him into some of the hottest sectors of the French front including the St. Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne, and while the corps was frequently under fire, he came through without an injury. He is one of many Americans who saw nothing French that looked quite as good to him as the same thing in America, and this includes the French climate and the French girls.
Returning with him was his neighbor and classmate John Burch, and along with this goes an interesting story. The grandfathers of these two boys—Senator Jas. W. Nesmith and Judge S. T. Burch—took up quarrel claims side by side near Richbush in 1842 and spent their lives there. The fathers of the two boys—W. G. Nesmith and T. S. Burch—were raised on the same adjoining farms. Then these two young soldiers grew up together on the farms, shared boyhood's joys and adventures together—enlisted in the same regiment on the same day—went through the war together, received their discharge at the same time and came home together.

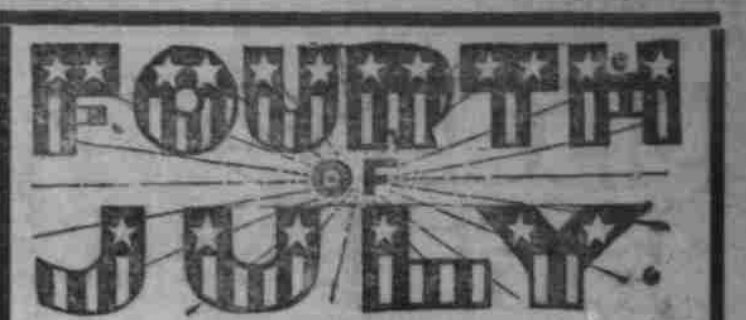
PORTLAND LABOR COUNCIL REJECTS STRIKE PROPOSAL

Portland, Or., June 27.—The central labor council at its meeting last night defeated a resolution pledging support to the proposed strike of street railway carmen July 4 in sympathy with the Monny strike movement.

President Wilson Will Be First To Sign Peace Pact

Paris, June 27.—President Wilson will be the first to sign the peace treaty at Versailles tomorrow, it was learned from an official source today.
Following Premier Clemenceau's announcement that the session is opened, a secretary will carry the document from the center of the horse shoe table to the French leader, according to present plans. Clemenceau will then pass it to Wilson, and possibly to Premier Lloyd-George, before signing it himself. The other delegates must walk to the small table within the horse shoe table to affix their signatures.
