Trans-Ocean Dirigible Delayed; Not To Reach New York Before Night

Harbor Grace, N. P., July 4. —The British dirigible R-34 is expected to reach St. Johns about 5 p. m. Greenwich time (1 p. m. New York time) it was learned today.

London, July 4. —(United Press) —The British dirigible R-34 was about 250 miles off the coast of Newfoundland at 3 p. m. Greenwich time (11 p. m. New York time), the air ministry announced today. Her position was announced as 51.20 north latitude and 48.40 west longitude.

This report indicated the craft had veered to the southward and probably would skirt the eastern coast of Newfoundland.

At 7 a. m. Greenwich time (3 a. m. New York time) the R-34 was reported at 48.40 north latitude and 49.30 west longitude, (about 200 miles off the Newfoundland coast and 325 miles northeast of St. Johns), indicating she was still bearing to the southward.

ACCIDENT PUTS BIG PLANE OUT OF ORDER

Machine Hits Soft Spot In Landing And Damages Propeller.

Accidents will happen in the best of families as well as with the best of airplanes, even a J-34D.

Yesterday afternoon while making a landing at Olcott field, the plane driven by Lieutenant Floyd Browne happened to land in a part of the field where there was a deep furrow that had been covered when the field was rolled down.

The airplane wheels in striking along this furrow, sank several inches and finally refused to move, resulting in the airplane tipping forward on the propellers. One of the blades was broken.

Lieutenant Browne immediately wired to Portland for an extra propeller which is expected to arrive late this evening or tomorrow morning.

Announcement is made that the flights promised will take place as soon as the plane is repaired and that all who have registered for an air flight will be given same, if it is necessary for the aviator to remain until next week.

After the plane was properly tuned up yesterday, the first to take flight with the aviator was Robert E. Perlich, a mechanic with the Valley Motor company. The first woman in the city to take the flight was Mrs. Gordon Wallace. Others who saw things as they are from above were Gordon Wallace, H. W. Hartman and Earle W. McDonough.

The accident happened to the plane when R. O. Hansen was a passenger. Anyhow, those who registered for a flight will be given it, although it will not be on the glorious Fourth.

According to information given out this morning, Lieutenant Crull was to leave Eugene some time this afternoon with Governor Olcott as passenger. After their arrival in the city, the plan as announced this morning was for a brief dedication of the Salem aviation field, to be known as Olcott Field. Milton R. Klepper, president of the Aero club of Oregon announced yesterday that he would assist in the dedication of the field. Governor Olcott will hereafter have the official position of honorary flight commander.
