### Storm Hastens Leave

The decision to start last night instead of waiting until 4 o'clock this morning, as announced yesterday afternoon, was reached by Major G. H. Seitz, commander at 10:15 p. m. It was occasioned by receipt of an official weather bureau bulletin urging haste because of the approach of a storm. By 11 o'clock the officers and crew had donned their flying clothes of gaspakin and everything was in readiness.

### Crisis Over New York

The property was purchased last week by Henry Wright from N. Durnelle and the work of wrecking the home immediately began. The Wayne residence is probably the oldest home in Dallas, having been built by John Wayne, one of the early pioneers of Polk county and a pioneer settler in the state. In the fore part of the sixties. For many years it was the most substantial house in the community and the excellent condition which the house is now in is a credit to the mechanics of the early days. Mr. Wayne was one of the first settlers of the Dallas Flouring Mills and was one of the county's influential citizens.

with American representatives who are negotiating other peace treaties. The American party of the Austrian treaty were substantially agreed on before the president left Paris, it was reported. Members of the American mission are sitting in and advising in all negotiations now being carried on. It was learned that ratification of the treaty will not in all likelihood remove the necessity for certain American military activities. The treaty provides from one to four months for the yielding up of war materials by Germany, which process is under direction of military forces. Germany has on hand equipment sufficient for several million men, and has millions of veterans within her borders. A sufficient guard will be maintained to keep the world from "nervousness."
