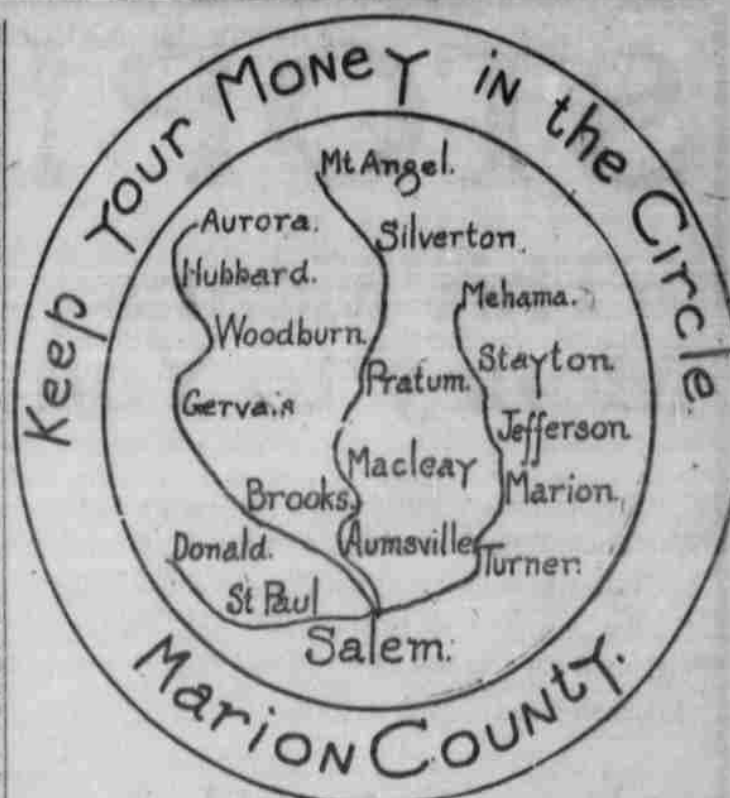
CHAUTAUQUA GRANTORS PLAN TICKET SELLING DRIVE OF CITY

FIRE ORDINANCE PASSED

(Capital Journal Special Service.) Dallas, Or., July 10.—At the regular semi-monthly meeting of the Dallas city council held at the city hall Monday evening that body passed an ordinance forbidding the setting out of fires and the burning of refuse, boxes and other combustible materials within the fire limits of the city. The action is the outcome of a fire caused here a few months ago when a bonfire was left burning without anyone to look after it and as a consequence it spread to adjoining property and destroyed several hundred dollars worth of merchandise. Had such an ordinance been in effect at that time the insurance companies could have made the careless ones pay for the loss. Notices to the effect of the passing of the ordinance were distributed among the business men and property owners in the restricted district, the same going into effect today.
