***** SHANTUNG CAUSE IS (Continued from page one) tere of poor, weak, downtrodden China pleading before the great world tribunal for justice—yet for money—pleading to be saved the humiliation of treating over thirty-six millions of her people, her industries, her holy land, the sacred dust of her ancestors, to the control and government of the one nation of all the earth she feared the most.

***** "And this we are asked to approve by a ratification of the treaty. We are now expected to add to this international crime by giving assent to approval to this in just judgment." Secret Agreement Charged.

***** Norris then told the story of an alleged secret agreement between Japan and the allies for the partitioning off of China, quoting correspondence between British, French and Italian diplomats and the Japanese government on the subject. "Thus," he said, "while the allies were trying to get China into the war so that they could get German ships in Chinese harbors, they were secretly plotting her destruction as soon as the war was over. It was agreed that after they had got out of China all they wanted, England would assist Japan at the council table in her claims against China."

***** "I do not believe there is recorded an instance of a more disgraceful and dishonorable agreement to carve up the territory, not of an enemy, but of an allied friend." Correspondence Cited.

***** "If this is a sample of the justice that will come of the league of nations, then what can weak and unarmed nations expect. This secret agreement entered into by the leading nations of the world at the unjust judgment that followed it shocks the sensibilities of those who honestly want to bring about a league of nations and causes them on the very threshold to question and doubt."

***** Following is the correspondence which, according to Norris, preceded the secret agreement: "From the British minister at Tokio to the Japanese government: "British embassy, Tokio, February 16, 1917.

***** "My Dear Excellency: "With reference to the subject of our conversation of the 27th ultimo when you excellency informed me of the desire of the imperial government to receive an assurance that on the occasion of peace conference his Britannic majesty's government will support the claims of Japan in regard to the disposal of Germany's right on the Shantung and possessions in the islands north of equator, I have the honor under instructions received from his Britannic majesty's principal secretary of state for foreign affairs, to communicate the following message from his Britannic majesty's government: "British Accede.

***** "His Britannic majesty's government accedes with pleasure to the request of the Japanese government for an assurance that they will support Japan's claims in regard to the disposal of Germany's rights in Shantung and possessions in the islands north of the equator on the occasion of the peace conference; it being understood that the Japanese government will in the eventual peace settlement, treat in the same spirit Great Britain's claims to the German islands south of the equator.

***** "I avail myself of this opportunity, M. Le Ministre, to renew to your excellency the assurance of my highest consideration. (Signed) Conyngham Green. "His Britannic majesty's ambassador.

***** Jap Demands Told. "The imperial Japanese government proposed demand from Germany at the time of peace negotiations the surrender of the territorial rights and special interests Germany possessed before the war in Shantung and the islands situated north of the equator in the Pacific ocean.

***** "The imperial Japanese government confidently hopes that the government of the French republic, realizing the legitimacy of these demands, will give assurance that her case being proved, Japan may count upon its full support on this question." French ambassador's reply.

***** "The government of the French republic is disposed to give the Japanese government its accord in regarding at the time of the peace negotiations questions vital to Japan concerning Shantung and the German island in the Pacific north of the equator. It also agrees to support the demands of the imperial Japanese government for the surrender of the rights Germany possessed before the war in this China province and these islands.

***** Ch't act Omitted. "M. Briand demands, on the other hand, that Japan give its support to obtain from China the breaking of the diplomatic relations with Germany and

Motono, his imperial Japanese majesty's minister for foreign affairs. Japanese Reply. Reply of the Japanese government, dated February 21, 1917: "The Japanese government is deeply appreciative of the friendly spirit in which your government has given assurance and happy to note it as fresh proof of the close ties that unite the two allied powers. I take pleasure in stating that the Japanese government on its part is fully prepared to support in the same spirit the claims which may be put forward at the peace conference in regard to the German possessions in the islands south of the equator." Japanese foreign minister to French ambassador at Tokio: "The imperial Japanese government has not yet formally entered into conversations with the entente powers concerning the conditions of peace I propose to present to Germany, because it is guided by the thought that such questions ought to be decided in concert between Japan and the said powers at the moment when the peace negotiations begin. Nevertheless, in view of recent developments in the general situation and in view of particular arrangements concerning peace conditions such as arrangements relative to the disposition of the Bosphorus, Constantinople and the Dardanelles being already under discussion by the powers interested, the imperial Japanese government believes that the moment has come for it to express its desires relative to certain conditions of peace essential to Japan and to submit them for the consideration of the government of the French republic."

Estimates Of Loss Due To Brownsville Fire Quite Heavy Brownsville, Or., July 15.—Estimates of the damages resulting from the fire Saturday which wiped out the buildings on the greater part of three blocks in the business section, run as high as several hundred thousand dollars, with little insurance. With the exception of one brick building, Howe's store, a firm of buildings on the north side of Spaulding avenue was razed. After a hard fight by volunteer firemen of Brownsville and Lebanon the old playing mill building, though a fire in many places, was saved. The Albany fire department also aided in fighting the flames.
