Acting on the order of the circuit court, Judge George G. Bingham and Judge Percy Kelly presiding, the Salem Kings Products company deposited on July 8, the sum of \$3000 and on July 15, a sum in excess of \$9000. This amount is based on the number of pounds certain growers are delivering to the company, at the rate of 3 1/2 cents a pound. The company pays these growers 5 1/2 cents on delivery and the amount on deposit with the county clerk at the close of the loganberry season will be paid according to the orders of the court.

The accident commission wishes to correct the erroneous impression given the public from the weekly accident report of last week, wherein Ted Howard, who was killed in a streetcar accident on June 21st, was listed as a trespasser. It has been the practice of the commission to classify accidents under the heading of employer, employee, passenger or patron, and if the injured person did not come within this classification, he was classed as trespasser. Ted Howard was not a trespasser within the usual meaning of that term at the time of his fatal accident. He was injured on the public street while in the course of his regular employment and for that reason the commission wishes to correct any wrong impression that may have been gained from its report.

FURTHER LITIGATION ON CONTRACTS OPENS

Here is another chapter in the loganberry troubles of this part of the Willamette valley.

R. D. Gibson brought suit this morning against H. B. Ridgeway, making the following allegations:

That a contract had been entered into to February 17, 1919, between Mr. Gibson and Mr. Ridgeway, by which the latter agreed to deliver all loganberries he raised on a four acre tract to Mr. Gibson.

That the price agreed upon was 5 3/4 cents, deliver to Mr. Gibson's evaporating plant at Liberty.

That Mr. Gibson had erected a dryer and gone to other expense to handle a business and that he had contracted with the Salem Fruit company for the dried berries.

That Mr. Ridgeway has failed to deliver the berries and that he had stated he did not intend to deliver them.

Mr. Gibson asks the court for the granting of a temporary restraining order restraining Mr. Ridgeway from delivering his berries other than to the plaintiff with whom he had contracted and that if he cannot deliver that he pay as damages the difference between 5 3/4 cents a pound the contract price and the present market price of 9 cents a pound.

And here is another page in the loganberry story.

Judge George G. Bingham yesterday granted a restraining order asked for by the Phez company against H. E. Warden, in which Mr. Warden is restrained from selling, disposing or giving away his logans except to the Phez company, provided, the Phez company deposits with the circuit court 3 1/2 cents a pound for every pound of logans Mr. Warden delivers. The money is to be held subject to the future orders of the court. This places Mr. Warden in the same situation as several who contracted with the King's Products company. They deliver the berries and the clerk of the circuit court holds the difference between the contract price and the present price until the case is tried on its merits. However, in the case of Mr. Warden, the market price of loganberries was placed at 8 cents while it really is 9 cents.

Habeas Corpus Writ Gives Child To Natural Parent

A writ of habeas corpus has been issued under the seal of the circuit court of Marion county upon the petition of Marie A. Shelton, directed against Lloyd Weeks and Florence B. Weeks of the Salem river road, wherein they are commanded to produce the body of Josephine Shelton formerly Josephine Matlock, into the circuit court at 1:30 o'clock Thursday afternoon of this week.

In the petition Marie A. Shelton alleges that she is the natural mother of Josephine Shelton and also the mother by adoption. That she believes Lloyd Weeks and Florence B. Weeks are the cause of restraining Josephine Shelton
