**CITY NEWS.** The funeral of James C. Shepherd, born Oct. 23, 1842, and died July 21, 1919 at the home of his son-in-law at Malalla, Or. Mr. Shepherd came from Scotland to Oregon in 1870 and was 76 years, 8 months and 23 days old at the time of his death. The funeral service was held in the First M. E. church, Sheridan, Wednesday July 24th, and was conducted by Rev. Alford Bates of Salem. Interment was in the Masonic cemetery, Sheridan, and the deceased was buried beside his wife, who died in July 1907. Miss Mildred Marcy, a sister of Mrs. Minnie Marcy Bates, is visiting Rev. and Mrs. Bates at Williamias. **Brixon & Jones** of this city have been awarded the contract for paving 950 feet, with a width of 16 feet of roadway, just this side of the Independence bridge. It is to be of six inch concrete with bituminous joints every 30 feet. This is the contracting firm that is using the First Methodist church for advertising purposes. It is doing some repair work on the steeple and has placed a placard in large letters, announcing the fact. Officially speaking, flood stage of the Willamette river in Salem is 20 feet above low water mark. But to get entirely above flood stage and possibilities of extra high water, the old elevator building of the former flouring mill on Trade street, now owned by the Oregon Pulp and Paper Mill Co. will be placed 30 feet above low water mark at the foot of Trade street. Concrete foundations are being poured today by Brixon & Jones, with concrete timbers for supports for the center of the mill, and above these will be erected timber supports to bring the floor of the mill to almost a level with Front street. In recent years there has been three high water marks. On Jan. 15, 1912, the water touched 24.7 feet above on Feb. 9, 1916, it reached 26 feet above and on Dec. 20, 1917, it was 23.6 feet above.

**Frank Bligh says the "Chin Chin"** comic opera announced for the Grand opera house next Monday evening is one of the best shows of the kind ever billed for Salem. It is a Dillingham production and really carries 55 performers. The show will also play at the Heilig theater in Portland. **Floyd D. Browne**, the aviator who came to Salem a short time ago and who was advised by his physician not to continue in aviation on account of his nervous breakdown, has formed a company entitled The Beaver Flying corporation. He has associated with him L. E. Fransson who says he has been engaged by the Argentine republic to map aerial routes this fall and Ralph Wortman, a banker of McMinnville. It is understood that Mr. Wortman has developed into a flying fan and will furnish the money to buy airplanes.

**Yesterday was the coldest day** of the month as the government's thermometer registered 71 above as the maximum. On the 1st of the month the maximum was 73 while on the 13th it was 72. The hottest day of the year so far was one week ago last Tuesday July 15, when the mercury reached 95. One year ago today the maximum temperature was 65.

**LIBERTY BOND QUOTATIONS** New York, July 25.—Liberty bonds: 3 1/2's, 99.40; first 4's, 94.99; second 4's, 94.46; first 4 1/2's, 95.94; third 4 1/2's, 95.04; fourth 4 1/2's, 93.94; victory 3 1/2's, 99.98; victory 4 1/2's, 99.99. The three year old son of Frank Howell at Hood River, while playing with matches, set fire to the house and completely destroyed the house of his parents. Although forest fires were started all over western and southern Oregon by the electric storm of Wednesday, State Forester Elliott states that no serious configurations have been reported to his office. Some of the fires under way are in old burns where the damage is comparatively small. It is reported that lightning caused no less than 11 fires in the Santiam national forest, 11 in the Detroit district, 6 in the Cascade district and 18 in the Umpqua forest. Marion county has been particularly free from fires, and the situation has been helped by the slight rainfall. Some days ago the governor added his personal request to the many requests that have gone to the Oregon delegation in congress that they use their influence in securing the modification of the tax on fruit juices. He is gratified to note in late reports from Washington that the house committee on ways and means has reported favorably on Congressman Hawley's bill, reducing the tax on loganberry and other juices from 10 per cent of the gross sales to a rate of 2 cents a gallon. The fight for this reduction has been carried on principally by the loganberry interests of the Willamette valley. Prof. W. O. Crosby, of Boston, who is one of a party of geological experts engaged at the request of State Engineer Cupper to investigate the site of a proposed irrigation reservoir in the vicinity of Bend, has discovered among other things that the canyon of the Deschutes is one of the most interesting regions in the United States from a geological standpoint—even more so than the Grand Canyon of the Colorado. He proposes to return to Oregon later and make a tour of the canyon for a detailed study of the formations.
