ADVERTISING IN PAPER SELLS COUNTRY PRODUCE Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, July 26.—Newspaper advertising of farm products is practiced more generally in other Western states than in Oregon, says the agricultural college press bulletin. The Idaho university press bulletin says that many farmers advertise in their local papers and do not consider the cost a waste of money. The news bulletins of the South Dakota college wrote letters to nearly 100 farmers asking them to give their experience with local newspaper advertising. Some of the answers follow: "We have been so successful in advertising our seed grains that next year we plan to erect a new granary and get more equipment to clean and handle grain. We must have a new truck." Hillcrest Farm, Clark, S. D. "We have found that it pays to use the local papers. The best success is with using those that enter our natural selling territory." Bevington Farms, Highmore. "We have been so successful in selling young pigs through local papers that we have been unable to keep up with the demand." J. M. Tucker, Edgemont. "Yes, it pays to let people know what you've got to sell. People believe an advertisement since they think their ad for stands good for its being true." M. A. Stocum, Ipswich. "I am sure it paid me to advertise in the local and farm papers. Perhaps a neighbor of mine may want just what you have to sell, and the way to let him know is to advertise it." Chas. P. McPherson, Sturgis. "A small ad in our local paper sold all our pure bred eggs for hatching. Yes."

OREGON COWS HOLD RECORD.

The highest average ever reported from as many as 3366 cows in five testing associations was made by Oregon herds for May, says E. L. Westover, federal and O. A. C. dairy extension specialist. The cows average 350.4 lbs. milk and 39.79 pounds fat. When it is understood that 40 pounds of fat a month puts cows of America in the honor class, the Oregon dairy cow performance is seen to show up the average as good as specials in other states. The best cow was Dui, owned by Joe Durrer of Tillamook, which made a record of 2210 pounds milk and 103.87 pounds fat in May—the best test of any cow west of the Mississippi river.

New York Capitalists To Extend \$100,000,000 Loan To German Interests Soon

Berlin, July 25.—(United Press).—New York financial interests have offered to extend Germany a credit of \$100,000,000 for the purchase of food and raw materials, according to cable advices received by the Deutsche bank here today from Martin Neudegg, German financial agent.

Nordreg said in his cablegram he would not close any negotiations until he arrived here and disclosed who had offered the credit and the terms of the advance.

Three big electrical companies in Germany, the General, Siemens and Bergmann, are planning to import weekly immense food shipments from America, it was learned today. These companies will distribute the food among their 150,000 employees instead of raising their wages. Bergmann, formerly a partner of Thomas Edison, is the prime mover in the enterprise.
