From the society page of August 1 1914, is the following: "The marriag New York, Aug. 1 .- The Ninth Intantry, 121 officers and over 5000 men, Tideomhe will be quietly solempized in first unit of the famous Second division Portland Monday, Aug. 3. Following to return home, arrived here today un-

expectedly on the transport Princess Matoika. The transport, originally destined to Newport News, was diverted at sea to this port.

This entire division is now on the sea and the Fifth and Sixth marines are exected within a few days.
