COMMERCIAL TRAVELERS SAY SALEM IS SHOWING RAPID BUSINESS SPURT

Charles G. Miller, manager of the Marion hotel, says the retail business in Salem must be good, judging from the number of traveling men now registering at the Marion.
For instance, yesterday, out of the 83 guests who registered, only 10 were tourists and the rest mostly men representing wholesale houses. And after a day's work, the salesmen come back to the hotel saying most complimentary things of the capital city, instead of the ground the city gave them several years ago.
Another instance cited by Mr. Miller showing changed retail conditions in the city, is the fact that many traveling salesmen who were accustomed to making Salem in one day and getting out on the evening trains, are now not only staying over night, but are giving two or three days in the city.
One representative of an outside house, after stating up the situation of Salem, with its King's Products company, its loganberry plants, its Oregon Co-operative association and the wonderful future of the prime industry, told Mr. Miller that for its size, Salem had better prospects for a growing city than any town of its size he had investigated in the west.
