STATE LIBRARIAN TO TRAVEL OVER ORIENT

Miss Marvin To Spend Five Months Visiting In Far East This Winter.

To study conditions in the Orient, Miss Corneilia Marvin, state librarian, has been granted a leave of absence of five months and will sail October 10 from Seattle on the Japanese steamship Kaishima Maru for Tokyo, Japan.
In her five months of travel in Japan, Korea, Manchuria, China, Indo-China, Java, Philippine Islands and Hawaiian Islands, Miss Marvin will be accompanied by Miss Jessica Todd, deputy of the Memorial normal school and Miss Mary Stuart Frazier, reference librarian of the historical society of Wisconsin.
Strips as it may seem to the average traveler, Miss Marvin found much difficulty in booking passage for herself and two friends not only from Seattle to Tokyo, but in the ocean trips to be taken later in December and January, and even in securing passage from Manila to Honolulu and to San Francisco, where they party is scheduled to arrive March 5, 1920.
The heavy ocean travel in the Orient, the steamship companies wrote Miss Marvin, made it necessary to secure passage several months ahead. This travel is in missions returning to the Orient and the general expansion of business, now that the war is over.
After spending a few weeks traveling in southern Japan, the party will cross to Korea to study the customs of that country now under the control of the Japanese and then into Manchuria, Peking, the capital of China, will be visited about the middle of December. The famous Shantung peninsula will be visited on the way to Hongkong where the party will spend Christmas.
New Year's day will be spent at Manila. From there American passengers of the party will sail early in January for Singapore on the Malay straits, where all vessels stop on voyages between the Indian and Pacific oceans.
From Singapore, passage has already been engaged for next February to Batavia, the capital of Java. If steamship accommodations are available, the party will visit the famous island of Borneo, which isn't so very far from the Philippine islands.
Miss Marvin, in her course of studies, has traveled extensively. During the winter and spring of 1909-1910, she traveled in Europe, spending the greater part of her time in Italy. A few years ago she spent the summer months in New England, Nova Scotia and the Province of Quebec. Last August she went into the service of the American Library association, devoting the time between August 25 and November 1 to library work with soldiers in Texas, New Mexico and Arizona.
American Ship Englewood Reported In Distress At Mouth Of Thames; Sinking
London, Aug. 13.—A Lloyd's dispatch from Dover today said that the steamship Englewood, from New York, has wireless from off Black Deep that she is sinking rapidly and asked that help be sent.
The Englewood is a war-built vessel, having been completed in 1918. She is registered at New York.
She is a 4500 ton steel screw vessel and in the property of the United States Shipping Board.
The Englewood left New York for Rotterdam July 29 with a general cargo.
Black Deep is off the mouth of the Thames river.

Law To Prevent Strikes On Railway Lines Is Requested

Washington, Aug. 13.—(United Press)—Legislation declaring railroad strikes unlawful was asked of congress today by Stephen C. Mason, president of the National Association of Manufacturers, in a statement before the house interstate commerce commission.
"We admit that it is not only the right but the duty of congress," said Mason, after stating he represented five thousand business firms and corporations, "to now exert its full authority to define the limits within which business men or working men, capital or labor, employer or employee, may go in threatening the transportation of the nation as a means of compelling the acceptance of economic demands or political policies."

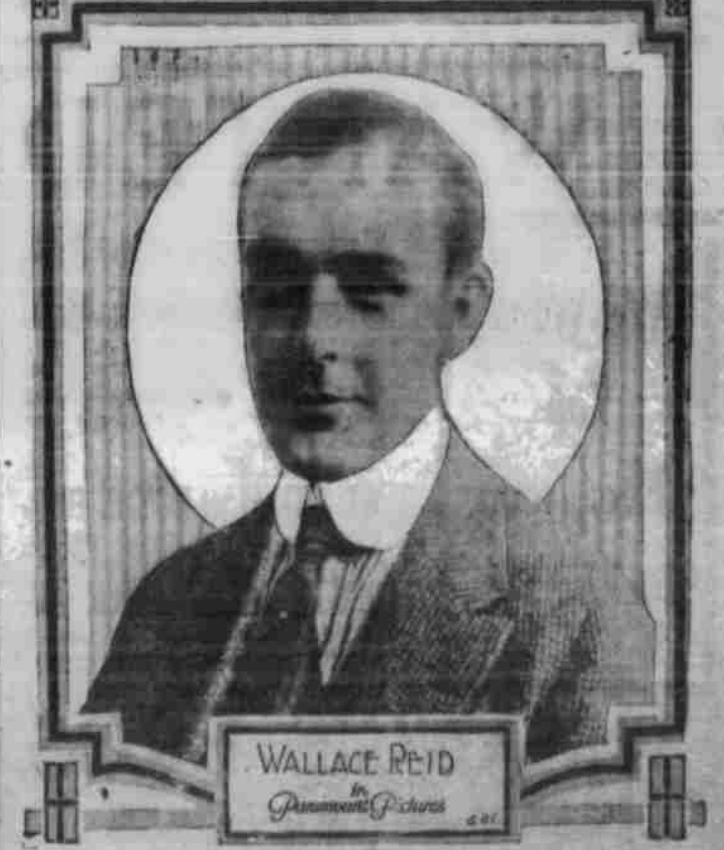
