Farmers may be obliged to store their wheat, Harley White said this morning as there is too much wheat arriving in Portland and no elevator accommodations. An embargo has already been put on one mill and it is thought it will be placed on others. It looks at present as if the farmer who insists on selling, must consign it to the government. Due to the fact that wheat must be held a month before grinding, there has been no milling of the immense quantities arriving in Portland. No wheat from the west has been exported to any extent and hence all the available space for holding wheat is full up.

While the citizens of Albany invested about \$400 in the food products sold by the war department, Salem people spent only \$75. It seems that a number of Salem folks were interested but when the fourth zone rate was figured out, they decided the home markets were good enough. On the list furnished every postmaster, dried beans were quoted at 6 1/2 cents a pound while baked beans were cheaper, quoted at 4 cents for a can weighing 1 1/2 pounds.

There is no guarantee on the prunes and the purchaser can see them where stored. In Portland there is 12,762 boxes of 50 pounds each of the 40-50 sizes and also 12,762 boxes of the 25 pound 40-50 sizes. Those stored in Portland were packed by the Salem Fruit Union, California Packing company and one other firm. No bids will be accepted for less than 3000 pounds.
