San Diego-Tijuana Road Meets Opposition; Termed As The "Highway To Hell"

San Diego, Cal., Sept. 3.—Plans to transform the little village of Tijuana, Lower California, into a second Monte Carlo, and the premier oasis of the southwest, went forward today with added zest following the statement late yesterday of Secretary Lansing.

Lansing's letter to Congressman Randall declaring that war time passport regulations could not be used to keep the international border closed between San Diego and Tijuana, meant that the last obstacle had been removed, and that the thirsty from the states would find relief below the border.

Bayton Long of Los Angeles has announced his intention of building a \$200,000 cafe, and James W. Coffroth, now in New York, is expected to re-establish racing at the Tijuana track about Thanksgiving.

Church people have branded the proposed paved highway from San Diego

to Tijuana as the "highway to hell," and are opposing it with might and main.

Curry County Gathering En-Masse For Trial Of Murderer At Gold Beach

Gold Beach, Or., Sept. 3.—Many families are arriving here with camping outfits.

COURT HOUSE NEWS

In the suit of Mary F. Gregoire vs H. L. Akerill and others, the court has granted an injunction restraining the defendants from removing or mortgaging the crop on the land involved in the suit.

The divorce suit of Ada Emmett against Arthur Emmett has been dismissed on motion of the attorney for the plaintiff.

The suit of L. D. Roberts against John Christie has been dismissed on motion of the attorney for the plaintiff. The case has been settled out of court.

L. S. Bennett and wife have brought suit against Mary E. Erbon and the heirs of B. Hoen and of Mary A. Hoen, deceased, to clear title to the NE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of section 29, T. 8, R. 1, E. The plaintiffs ask that these heirs appear and be required to set forth their interest in the property if any. They also ask that they be declared owners of the property in fee simple.

The estate of Permilla A. Caspell who died Aug. 21 is valued at \$700 in personal property and \$10,000 in real estate. There are 13 children and Frank E. Caspell has been appointed administrator.

The final account of Annie Baker Charlton as administratrix of the estate of Ruby Baker has been approved and the administratrix relieved of further liability.

The estate of Elvira Brumberg has been appraised by Navre Knudsen, Ole Amund and S. M. Edlicott. The estate consists of 1 1/2 acres of land and a house just on the suburbs of Woodburn.

COUNCIL POSTPONES PLUMBING QUESTION

No Warrants Yet Issued On Complaints Sworn Out By City Attorney.

No action was taken at the meeting of the city council last evening regarding the refusal of four plumbing firms in the city to comply with the ordinance providing that all plumbing establishments shall pay an annual fee of \$20. Last Saturday City Attorney Maey issued and filed complaints against T. M. Barr, A. L. Fraser, John B. Nathman and Otto Muellhaupt, charging them with a violation of the city ordinance in not paying the license fee. However, up to a late hour this afternoon no warrants had been issued out of the office of the city recorder for the arrest of these plumbers. The plumbing firms that have complied with the order of the city council are Graber Bros., Patton Plumbing Co., Nelson Bros. and L. Ashelman. Gerald Volk, alderman and chairman of the plumbing committee is of the opinion that the sanitary situation in the city is bad and that something must be done to provide for inspected plumbing. On account of the refusal of four firms to comply with the ordinance, it is probable this plumbing question will be given a thorough hearing at an early meeting of the city council.

J. S. R. 1 E was appraised at \$11,250, as lot in Woodburn was valued at \$1000 and there was \$6,444 in a Woodburn bank. The remainder of the estate was in notes given Mr. Soules and in personal property.

In the matter of the estate of James B. Leigh, the administrator Ephriam Shepard has been notified by Charles Chadek that he will appeal to the county court on Sept. 25 for the allowance of his claims against the estate. Mr. Chadek claims \$795.80 and these claims have been rejected by the administrator.

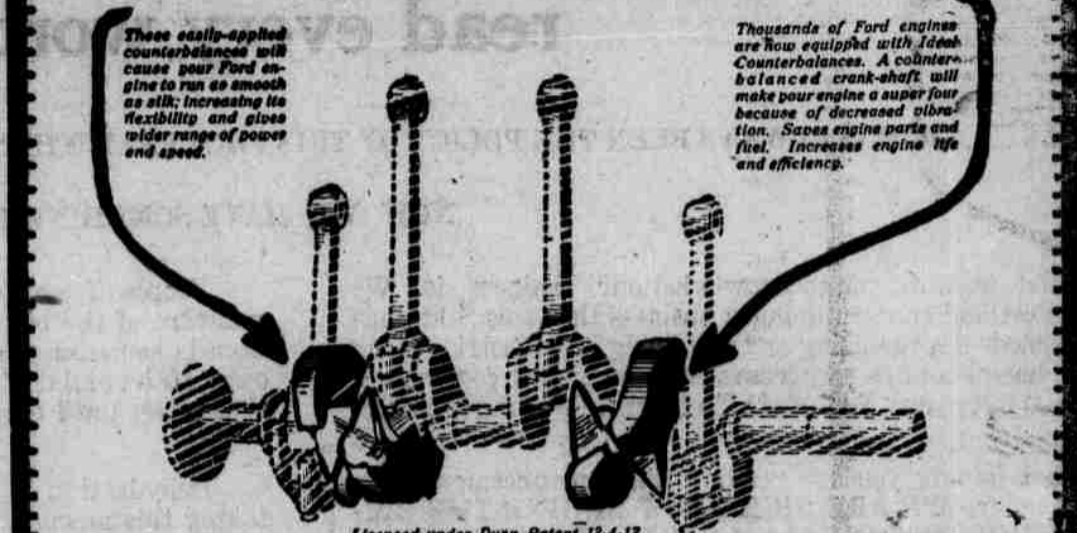

Telephone Rates Are the Prices Which the Public Is Asked to Pay for Telephone Service.

To be just and reasonable, telephone rates or prices must cover the costs of rendering the service and leave a profit that will attract to the telephone industry a continuing supply of capital which is constantly required for extension and improvements.

If rates yield more or less than such amount they are not just. If they yield more they are excessive and unreasonable. If they yield less they are unreasonable and are against public interest because they result in a deteriorated service and capital is no longer attracted but directed to other industries that are more profitable and possibly the products of many such industries are of less importance to the public.

The present rates we believe to be just and reasonable. They were approved by the Postmaster General and are effective by Act of Congress.

These rates are now being reviewed by the Public Service Commission of Oregon, which body assumes jurisdiction since the Government turned back the telephone properties to private ownership.
