**PHYSICAL WORK
TO EXTEND ALL
THRU SCHOOL**

The physical training of the children of Oregon from the time of their entry into school life throughout the twelve years of the ordinary school work is being undertaken for the first time this year as a part of the regular school program under a law enacted by the last legislature upon the recommendation of J. A. Churchill, state superintendent of public instruction.

The course of study covering this feature of the educational program has been worked out by a committee appointed by Superintendent Churchill, consisting of Dr. A. D. Browne, head of the department of physical education of the Oregon Agricultural college; Miss Mabel Cummins, head of the department of physical education at the University of Oregon, and Laura Taylor, head of the physical education department of the Oregon Normal school. The course contemplates the promotion of correct physical posture and bearing, mental and physical alertness, self control, disciplined initiative, sense of patriotic duty and a spirit of co-operation under leadership.

Section one of the syllabus of the course, contains a preface by Superintendent Churchill, the state law providing for physical training in the schools and the introduction of section two covers the methods, special instruction to all teachers and classification of physical education section three is divided into chapters which are arranged for the purpose of segregating the material according to the age periods of the children, these instructions being given in the most definite manner possible with

illustrations of children in different postural positions.

An instructor from one of the state schools will attend each county teachers' institute this year for the purpose of drilling the teachers in the various exercises in order that they may pass the instruction on to the students under their charge.

**PLANS FOR LAUSANNE
HALL ARE APPROVED**

At a meeting of the executive board of Willamette University held last evening the plans furnished by Architect Legge for the new Lausanne hall were given their final survey, some minor alterations suggested, and finally accepted as being in every way satisfactory.

The committee will at once advertise for bids on construction. Doubtless there will be a large number of bidders as the new hall will be a work of art and a credit to any builder.

The specifications call for a high grade of brick with grey stone trimmings to conform with the other buildings on the campus, and an interior finish of the most modern type. The location upon the campus has not as yet been exactly determined, this waiting upon the completed survey of the grounds. With the present fearful cost of labor and materials it is to be expected that the building will call for a much larger expenditure than at first estimated.
