

COMPARISON OF WORLD'S SERIES TEAMS IS MADE

New York, Sept. 24.—Gleason has a better trio patrolling his garden than Moran can produce.

The outer defense of the White Sox doesn't rank with the greatest of the game, nor has it the smashing attack of the Tiger outfielders. But in Jackson, Pelsch, Liebold and J. Collins, the American leaguers have a more formidable array of talent than Rousch, Neale, Magee and Ducean.

As in the case of their infield, where they have a pair that fairly shouts its class, both the Reds and White Sox have in the gardens a bulwark of strength in Rousch and Jackson. This pair embodies almost the maximum smashing power with the bat, while in Rousch and Pelsch there is a pair that is outclassed only by the great Tris Speaker in the range of operations.

The most glaring weakness of Moran's club is in left field. It has both

ered the great Red leader all season. In the last month the problem seemed solved with the arrival of Pat Duncan from the Southern League. His work has been close to sensational. But it is not sure that Moran will try a green youngster in the big series.

A smashing hitter. The league's leading batter and a fielder who covers acres of ground, Eddie Rousch out-classes Happy Felsch in centerfield. He has a fifty point advantage over the White Sox star in batting, has scored more runs, poled out more hits and is faster on the bases.

The afternoon sun which floods the right field of the Cincinnati yard will drive Joe Jackson to left field for the series. Compared to Sherwood Magee he towers in strength over the protector of the Red left garden. Jackson is having one of his best years, batting around .348, while Magee's stick work amounts to .228. Moran has been resting the veteran for several weeks and he may come back to participate in his first world's series with a new lease on life. Duncan has not only plugged up the hole admirably, but he has been somewhat sensational in his work in 24 games he has batted .246 and proved himself reliable in pinches.

"Nemo" Liebold and "Shano" Collins both get the call over "Greasy" Neale. Bating only .248, Neale falls behind both "Nemo" and Collins, who have made their sticks work for .298 and .258, respectively.

School Librarian Divides Books Among City Schools

There are between 8000 and 9000 volumes, including principally reference books, travel and fiction. It is planned to have some one teacher in each building to have charge of the books and arrange for the "traveling libraries" to be used in each grade, as well as to have oversight of the children's reading. Included in each collection of books is a group of "best books" which the children are encouraged to read, those who read at least eight of these books being awarded a star at the end of the term. The school library has received about 400 new volumes this year.

GOLD HILL IRRIGATION BOND ISSUE APPROVED

Twenty-five thousand dollars worth of bonds of the Gold Hill irrigation district were certified to by the irrigation securities commission at a meeting Tuesday. This issue will be used in paying off obligations incurred and money advanced in construction work already completed. The district already has \$60,000 in bonds outstanding.

The certification of \$15,000 worth of bonds for the Squaw Creek irrigation district in Deschutes county was also authorized by the commission. This money will be used to build a permanent headgate and make other improvements in the system which the district acquired some time ago at which time \$94,000 worth of bonds were issued.

The payment of interest on bonds of the Ochocho irrigation district in the sum of \$1,250,000 and on the Warm Springs irrigation district on bonds in the amount of \$1,350,000 was considered by the commission. Judge Dalton Biggs of Malheur has been asked by the commission to act as appraiser of lands in the Warm Springs district and R. A. Ward of the First National bank of Bend has been asked to act as appraiser of lands in the Ochocho district.

OPINION SETTLES OPEN GAME SEASON QUERY

In an opinion given by Attorney General George M. Brown to M. A. Biggs, district attorney for Harney county, the shooting season for ducks, geese and other migratory waterfowl has been definitely settled. Confusion has existed in the minds of many shooters on account of a difference in the federal and state seasons. The state cannot legislate within the closed season of the federal regulations, but it can legislate within the open season. The federal open season is three and one-half months, but the state, if it care to, may close any portion or all of this federal open season. The shooting season, therefore, which must be observed by hunters throughout Oregon is as follows:

For Multnomah, Clatsop, Columbia

and Tillamook counties, the open season begins on October 1 and closes December 31. In all other counties of game district No. 1, which comprises all that portion of Oregon lying west of the summit of the Cascade mountains, the season opens on October 16th and closes on January 15th. In all counties of game district No. 2, which comprises all that portion of Oregon lying east of the summit of the Cascade mountains, the open season begins on October 1 and ends on December 31st.
