

## STATE IS ASKED TO AID IN FIGHT ON LIVING COSTS

The causes of the present high cost of living and some suggested remedies for this condition are outlined in a statement issued by the United States Council of National Defense, composed of a member of President's Wilson's cabinet, a copy of which has just been received by Governor Olcott with a request for cooperation in its most widespread distribution.

"The statement is issued only after long and careful consideration by all the members of the council as the first step in an educational campaign which the council is undertaking in connection with the high cost of living," reads a letter accompanying the bulletin. "It is the belief of the council that an intelligent understanding by the people of the causes of the high cost of living is essential to intelligent steps toward remedying the situation."

A careful investigation of the situation, the statement says, has revealed:

"That the nation's productive powers have not been fully utilized since the armistice.

"That too few goods, notably the necessities of life, have been produced, and that even some of these have been withheld from the market, and therefore from the people.

"That the high cost of living is due in part to unavoidable war waste and increase of money and credit.

"That there has been and is considerable profiteering, intentional and unintentional."

The council believes that the remedies for the situation are:

"To produce more goods, and to produce them in proportion to the needs of the people.

"To stamp out profiteering and stop unnecessary hoarding.

"To enforce vigorously present laws and promptly to enact such further new laws as are necessary to prevent and punish profiteering and needless hoarding.

"To bring about better cooperation and method in distributing and marketing goods.

"To keep both producer and consumer fully informed as to what goods are needed and as to what supplies are available, so that production may anticipate the country's demands."

"Goods and not money are the means of life," the bulletin continues. "Better standards of living are impossible without producing more goods. Man can not consume what has not been produced."

"Work, save, cooperate, produce," the bulletin concludes.

## OLCOTT PARDONS EDITOR; IS TOLD TO LEAVE STATE

Ham Kautzman, former Columbia county newspaperman sentenced to a term in the Multnomah county jail for the publication of obscene matter in his paper, the Holton Herald, was granted a pardon by Governor Olcott Thursday on condition that he leave the state and remain out, refraining from the publication or editing of a newspaper in Oregon at any time hereafter.

"Violation of these conditions will mean that he will be returned to serve the unexpired portion of his sentence," declared Governor Olcott last evening in commenting on the pardon.

The action of Governor Olcott was based upon the investigation into the Kautzman case of Millar McGilchrist of the attorney general's office and on recommendations contained in his report to the governor's office. The investigation had been requested by the Oregon State Editorial association in a resolution adopted at its recent annual meeting.

"The issuance of the pardon is based largely upon the statement of a reputable physician that it would be homicidal to allow Kautzman to remain confined in jail," the governor stated last evening.

"I might make this comment on Kautzman's case; that I believe he was fairly tried and honestly convicted and I am convinced, after examination of issues of his newspaper, that he is not a fit person to engage in the newspaper business. Considering the nature and indecency of his offense I believe the sentence imposed was a fair one. But I am certain the state does not wish to further enforce this sentence if it might lead to fatal consequences."

## LOWER RATE ON PULP WOOD BEING SOUGHT

The reduction of freight rates on a pulp wood to a parity with that of fuel wood is urged by Fred G. Buechel, chairman of the public service commission, in a letter to Max Thelen, director of the federal railroad administration, Washington, D. C.

In the state of Washington, he points out, pulp wood and fuel wood are given the same freight rate while the paper mills in Oregon are denied the same privilege. This, he declares, is an evident discrimination in favor of Washington interests.

"This commission believes that the present wood rates are remunerative and in instances might even reasonably be reduced," Buechel writes. "Further that Oregon's wood rates for comparable distance and conditions should be reduced to conform to the schedules effective in the state of Washington."
